

## As a new delegate to a UEMS Body...

Firstly, welcome to the UEMS family!

Secondly, make sure you respect these three criteria:

- You are a medical specialist in active practice;
- You are nominated by your National Medical Association that is a member of UEMS – see the list of all NMAs here. Your letter of endorsement or confirmation email from your National Medical Association (not your affiliated National Scientific Society) must be sent to the UEMS Coordinator with a copy to the Secretary General.
- English proficiency required.

As a delegate you are mostly in touch with the Executive of your UEMS Body. They usually include a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. They will inform you of topics regarding the Section, Division, Multidisciplinary Joint Committee or Thematic Federation such as meetings, reports, update on the <u>European Training Requirements</u>, reimbursement procedures.

Please keep them as well as the <u>UEMS Coordination department</u>, <u>coordination@uems.eu</u> informed of any changes in your contact details, and be as active as possible.

## What is UEMS? What are the different bodies?

- UEMS is the oldest medical organization in Europe (1958).
- It currently has 41 members: 31 full members; 5 associate members; 5 observers.
- There are currently <u>43 Specialist Sections and Boards; 17 Divisions; 19 Multidisciplinary Joint Committees; and 7 Thematic Federations.</u>

What are the differences between these Bodies?

- A **Section** is a medical specialty;
- A **Division** represents a field of interest of only one medical specialty;
- A **MJC** represents a field of interest of several medical specialties;
- A **TF** also represents a field of interest of several medical specialties, but their activities focus on the general added-value of a discipline rather than scientific and training issues;
- A **European Board** is in charge of the organization of examinations of a medical specialty.

The UEMS works with EU Institutions as well as other European Medical Organisations (EMOs) and Scientific Societies (ESSs) to improve standards for high quality healthcare practice.
